**OPERATION BLUE STAR ANNIVERSARY**

## Amritsar to be on high alert; SGPC, Dal Khalsa make public their plans

AMRITSAR POLICE are expecting a deployment of approximately four companies of paramilitary forces, along with an additional 5,000 state police personnel, for the Operation Blue Star anniversary.

The anniversary is observed at the Akal Takht on June 6 every year. The Amritsar police will remain on alert for the entire week as Dal Khalsa has called for a remembrance parade on June 5 and a bandh in Amritsar on June 6.

The Shiromani Gurdwara Parbandhak Committee (SGPC) is also planning to display a bir (copy) of Guru Granth Sahib, which was hit by a bullet during the Army's action inside the premises of the Golden Temple to flush out militants holed up in the shrine in 1984.

"We will deploy two companies of the Central Reserve Police Force (CRPF) and two companies

of the Rapid Action Force (RAF). Around 1,500 personnel from the Punjab Armed Police and different district police have already reached Amritsar. We are expecting approximately 5,000 personnel from different wings of the Punjab Police, in addition to the four paramilitary companies. The exact numbers will be finalised tomorrow (Thursday)," said a spokesperson for the Amritsar police.

The anniversary function has remained largely peaceful in recent years. However, this year's anniversary will be observed in the shadow of a crackdown on pro-Khalistani preacher Amritpal Singh and his outfit 'Waris Punjab De' and three minor blasts reported in the vicinity of Harmandir Sahib.

Mostly separatist organisations gather during the anniversary.

"We are organising a 'Holocaust' remembrance parade in Amritsar to pay homage to the people who fought for our cause and to tell the Centre that

we have not forgotten and forgiven the perpetrators of Operation Blue Star," said Paramjit Singh Mand, a Dal Khalsa leader.

Regarding their plans for the anniversary, an SGPC spokesperson said, "On the occasion of Ghallughara Diwas (Holocaust Day), the Sri Akhand Path Sahib will be started at Sri Akal Takht Sahib on June 4, and the bhog (concluding ceremony) will be held on June 6. The holy saroop (copy) of Sri Guru Granth Sahib Ji, which was hit during the military attack in June 1984, will also be displayed on June 6 at Gurdwara Shaheed Baba Gurbaksh Singh Ji for the Sangat (congregation) to pay obeisance."

SGPC president Harjinder Singh Dhami said, "The Sikh community can never forget the pain of the June 1984 Holocaust. This day is very grave and emotional for the Sikh community, and the Sikhs should pay tribute to the martyrs according to their sentiments."

## Mann holds talk with students of 'Schools of Eminence'

## Meet 7 Haryana civil services officers from same batch who cracked UPSC exam this year

THEY SAY it's hard to believe in coincidence, but it's even harder to believe in anything else.

As many as seven Haryana civil services (HCS) officers from the same batch – who are currently under-training – have cracked the prestigious Union Public Service Commission (UPSC) civil services examination this year.

They were among 48 candidates who had cleared the Haryana Public Service Commission (HPSC) examination-2021, the results of which were declared in February this year. Currently, they are under-training at Haryana Institute of Public Administration (HIPA) in Gurgaon. HIPA Director General Chandralekha Mukherjee says: "It's a very proud moment for all of us. They have worked hard and they are on the way to achieving their dreams and serving the country."

Anjali Garg – who is from Panchkula and had secured fifth place in the HPSC examination – got 79th rank in the UPSC exam. Anjali told The Indian Express that she topped the UPSC examination in the optional subject – medical science. After her schooling from Chandigarh's



DAV Model School (Sector-15), Anjali moved to Delhi's Safdarjung hospital and medical college to pursue her MBBS. Anjali says: "The pattern of the HCS (2021) exam was like the UPSC, so it proved beneficial to us. No doubt, the UPSC exam is much tougher than that taken by the HPSC."

Sakshi, who is from Bahadurgarh (Jhajjar), had bagged third position in the HPSC examination. In the UPSC examination, she secured 220th rank. Being from an OBC community (Jangra), she is hopeful to get the assignment of IAS during the allocation of services. Her father Ashok Kumar is a section officer in School of Open Learning in Delhi, while her mother Madhu Bala is a homemaker. About the prestigious exam of the UPSC, Sakshi says: "The examination of the civil services is unpredictable, but hard work pays a lot."

Kamal Chaudhary, who is from Mohali, had topped the HPSC examination by securing 398.75 out of a total of 675 marks (600 mains examination + 75 interview). However, in the UPSC examination, Kamal got 656th rank. His father Des Raj is

an employee of Haryana transport department, while mother Santosh is a homemaker. His schooling took place in Chandigarh's government model school (Sarangpur) and Bal Niketan School (Sector-37). Kamal says: "Being an all-India exam, the success in the UPSC gives a person much pride and happiness."

Pragati Rani from Kurukshetra had secured second place in the HPSC examination by securing 398 marks, while in the UPSC exam she got 740th rank. A radiologist by profession, Pragati got married to a medical professional (Dr Atul Verma) four years ago. Mother of a two-and-a-half-year-old son, Pragati says: "Family support is must for such a prestigious examination. I could make it to the UPSC final list just because of the family support all the time." Pragati's father-in-law R C Verma, a former IAS officer, is currently a member of Haryana State Police Complaint Authority.

Rahul Sangwan had secured 27th rank in the HPSC examination, while he got 508th rank in the UPSC exam. Rahul is from Mitathal village of Haryana's Bhiwani district. His father Neer Kumar is a schoolteacher, while mother Urmila Devi is an anganwari worker. Rahul says: "The pattern of the UPSC and HPSC is

almost the same. However, the UPSC examination is comparatively a lengthy affair which goes for 8-9 days, while the HPSC exam is concluded in just two days."

Arti from Haryana's Rewari had secured 25th rank in the HPSC examination, while she got 592nd rank in the UPSC examination. Her parents – father Bishamber Dyal and mother Munesh Yadav – are working as inspectors in the state excise and taxation department. Arti, who did her master's degree in geology from Delhi University, says: "The exams of the civil services are very unpredictable but one must persevere with it and keep working hard. If not at first, one may find success in the second or third attempt."

Bhawesh Khyalia – who is from Bhiwani's Jhanwari village – got 280th rank in the UPSC examination, while he had secured 12th position in the HPSC exam. His mother Sushila Khyalia is a schoolteacher, while his father Rajkumar Khyalia is a retired college principal. Narender Khyalia, a family member, says: "Ahead of the UPSC examination, Bhawesh studied for 15-16 hours daily. His uncle in the extended family Yudhbir Singh Khyalia, a former IAS officer, has been a source of inspiration for Bhawesh."

## Khattar to meet Sukhu on June 5; to take up Kishau dam issue

HARYANA CHIEF Minister Manohar Lal Khattar will meet Himachal Pradesh CM Sukhinder Singh Sukhu on June 5, official sources said on Wednesday.

The major points of discussion between the two leaders shall comprise the construction of Kishau dam, work of a new parallel linked channel from Dadpur to Hamida head, Saraswati river rejuvenation and heritage development project, SYL canal water via Himachal Pradesh and imposition of cess on electricity.

This was announced during a high-level review meeting chaired by CM Khattar on Wednesday. During the meeting with the administrative secretaries to review projects worth more than Rs 100 crore, CM Khattar directed officials to formulate a detailed plan to drain out water from the waterlogged areas to the low-water areas of the state, so that the farmers in low-water areas can avail the benefits," a state government spokesperson said.

CM Khattar said that the government is formulating various schemes for drinking water and irrigation as it is the priority of the government to provide uninterrupted clean water in sufficient quantities to the public.

The officers of the departments concerned appraised the Chief Minister of the work being done for remodelling of Gurugram Water Service channel and construction of the Mewat Feeder Canal project, be-

sides increasing the capacity of the JLN canal and enhancing capacity of Hansi branch's carrier system. These irrigation and water projects will provide relief in areas with groundwater crises.

CM Khattar was told that works related to the remodelling of the augmentation canal in Yamunanagar, concrete linking and remodelling from Munak head (Karnal) to Khubru Head (Sonapat), increasing the capacity of STP channel in Dhanwapur and Behrampur (Gurugram), construction of water conveyance system and allied structures for the supply of water to Gorakhpur, Fatehabad, RCC retaining wall in Jua drain, Jhajjar among other projects are being expedited, the spokesperson said. "Haryana aims to strengthen Metro rail, road network at Gurugram and Faridabad"

"The state government is aiming to strengthen the Metro rail and road network at Gurugram and Faridabad. For this, Gurugram Metropolitan Development Authority (GMDA) will commence the civil work on the 28 kilometres metro rail network in Gurugram within a month," CM Khattar said.

The government is also formulating the Metro rail connectivity from Rezag La Chowk to Sector 21 Dwarka and Regional Rapid Transit System from Sarai Kale Khan to Panipat.

The officers appraised the Chief Minister that 100 MLD water treatment plant is also being built in Dhanwapur, besides 100 MLD water treatment plant at Chandu Budhera; the construction of which will start in June.

## Bambiha gang member arrested for Amritsar man's murder

PUNJAB POLICE claimed a breakthrough in a May 24 murder with Anti-Gangster Task Force (AGTF) arresting Gurveer Singh alias Guri, one of the accused involved in the killing of Jarnail Singh in Sathiala village of Amritsar. The police have recovered one .32 calibre pistol along with seven live cartridges from him.

The development comes a day after Punjab Police established the role of Bambiha gang behind the killing of Jarnail Singh and released pictures of 10 members of the Bambiha gang found involved in the killing of Jarnail Singh, who was killed by four armed persons on May 24.

DGP Gaurav Yadav said that

a team of AGTF led by AIG AGTF Sandeep Goel have arrested the Gurveer alias Guri, who is a shooter of Bambiha gang and has a criminal history with a number of criminal cases including murder, attempt to murder, snatching, NDPS Act and Arms Act registered against him. The arrested accused has also been declared as proclaimed offender, he added.

The operation was assisted by DSP Rajan Parminder and DSP Bikram Brar.

Yadav said that as per preliminary investigations, accused Gurveer had hatched a conspiracy along with Manpreet Singh alias Munn, presently in Portugal, and Balwinder Singh alias Doni to eliminate Jarnail Singh. Gurveer Guri also met the shooters involved in the murder

and provided them weapons to carry out this murder, he said. Manpreet Munn is a brother of absconding gangster Gurpreet Singh alias Gopi Ghanshpuria.

The DGP said that accused Gurveer Guri has also confirmed the involvement of Gagandeep Singh alias Daddi, Jobanjeet Singh alias Billa, Joban, Gurmej Singh, Manjit Mahal and two other criminals, who are yet to be identified, in the murder of Jarnail Singh.

AIG AGTF Sandeep Goel said that Gurveer Guri was also wanted in a case of opening fire on the police party deployed at the checking naka in the area of Police Station Sohana in SAS Nagar. In another crime, the accused Gurveer Guri had opened fire at a doctor in SBS Nagar, he said.

## 'Op Clean': Over 5,000 cops raid 2,247 locations in anti-drugs drive

PUNJAB POLICE on Wednesday launched a massive state-wide operation named "OP Clean" wherein 650 police teams comprising over 5,000 personnel raided more than 2,000 locations across the state to keep a tab on activities of people involved in smuggling of commercial quantities of drugs.

Disclosing this here on Wednesday, Special DGP Law and Order Arpit Shukla said the operation was conducted on the direc-

tions of Director General of Police (DGP) Punjab Gaurav Yadav.

"Places/houses linked with the drug smugglers/drug peddlers were raided simultaneously during this operation, which was conducted from 7 am to 12 noon. All the CPs/SSPs were asked to personally monitor this operation and make a sufficient number of police teams under the supervision of gazetted rank officers, so that they could carry out raids in a synchronised manner," he added.

As many as 650 police teams, involving over 5,000 police personnel, raided 2,247 locations and conducted searches at 2,125

houses of people having involvement in drug smuggling cases.

The Special DGP said that the police teams recovered 1.8 kg heroin, 82 kg poppy husk, 1 kg opium, Rs 5.35 lakh drug money and four weapons from them, besides recovering illicit liquor, lahan (raw material used to make liquor) and vehicles after registering 48 FIRs across the state. Police teams also seized 78 mobile phones, which will be sent for forensic examination.

Shukla said that a thorough search of houses of people involved in drug smuggling was conducted during the operation.

## From 'Punjab Limited' to Punjab Mail, fastest train of British-era completes 111 years of service

Mumbai: The Punjab Mail, the fastest train in India during the British-era which now runs between Mumbai and Firozpur Cantonment in Punjab, completed 111 years of operations on Wednesday, transforming from three passenger-carrying cars to more than 20 coaches over the years and becoming a prominent train of the Central Railway.

Another prestigious train of the Central Railway, the Mumbai-Pune Deccan Queen, will enter the 94th year of operations on June 1.

The Punjab Mail, originally called 'Punjab Limited', made her maiden run out of Ballard Pier Mole station, which no longer exists, in Mumbai for Peshawar in the present-day Pakistan, on June 1, 1912, according to a CR release.

"Ballard Pier Mole station was actually a hub for GIPR serv-

ices. The Punjab Mail, or Punjab Limited as she was then called, finally steamed out on 1st June 1912. To begin with, there were the P&O steamers bringing in the mail, and the officers of the Raj, along with their wives, on their first posting in colonial India," said the release.

The Great Indian Peninsula Railway (GIPR) was a predecessor of the Central Railway.

The Punjab Limited used to run on fixed mail days from Ballard Pier Mole station all the way to Peshawar via the GIP route, covering a distance of 2,496 km in about 47 hours. The train comprised six cars – three for passengers and three for postal goods and mail.

"The three passenger-carrying cars had a capacity of just 96 passengers," the release stated.

During the pre-Partition period, the Punjab Limited was the

fastest train in British India. Its route ran over GIP track for the large part and passed through Itarsi (in Madhya Pradesh), Agra, Delhi and Lahore before terminating at Peshawar Cantonment, it said. The train started originating and terminating at Bombay VT (now Chhatrapati Shivaji Maharaj Terminus or Mumbai CSMT) from 1914. The train then loosely came to be known as the Punjab Mail, rather than Punjab Limited, and became a daily service, said the release.

Third class coaches started appearing on the Punjab Mail by the mid-1930s, while it got an air-conditioned car in 1945.

The electric hauled train currently takes 32.36 hours to cover the 1,930 km distance between Mumbai and Firozpur Cantonment with 52 intermediate stops. The Punjab Mail has

one AC First Class-compartment, two AC-2 compartments, six AC-3 Tier, 6 sleeper class, one pantry car, five general second class coaches and one generator van. Another CR release said the introduction of 'Deccan Queen' between Mumbai and Pune on June 1, 1930, was a major landmark in the history of then-Great Indian Peninsula Railway.

"This was the first deluxe train introduced on the railway to serve 2 important cities of the region and was aptly named after Pune, which is also known as 'Queen of Deccan' (Dakkhan ki Rani)," the release said.

According to the release, initially, the train was introduced with two rakes of seven coaches each, one of which was painted in silver with scarlet mouldings and the other with royal blue with gold lines.

"The under frames of the

coaches of the original rakes were built in England while the coach bodies were built in the Matunga workshop (in Mumbai) of the GIP Railway," the release said.

The Deccan Queen, initially, had only first class and second-class accommodations. The first class was abolished on January 1, 1949, and the second class was redesigned as first class, which continued up to June 1955 when third class was introduced for the first time.

The coaches of the original rakes were replaced in 1966 by anti-telescopic steel bodied integral coaches built by Integral Coach Factory, Perambur (Tamil Nadu). These coaches incorporated improved design of bogies for better riding comfort and also improvements in the interior furnishings and fittings, said the CR.

Colorado curbs diet pills, limits BMI link to treatment

Governor signs bills to address growing cases of eating disorders

DENVER: In the midst of a surge in eating disorders across the country, Colorado's acting governor signed bills on Tuesday that will create a state program dedicated to addressing mental illness and limit the use of body mass index (BMI) in determining treatment as well as restrict the sale of diet pills to minors.



Colorado's Lieutenant Gov. Diana Primavera in her capacity as acting governor, will largely axe the use of BMI in determining the level of treatment for eating disorders, even though it remains an industry standard.

Eating Disorder Foundation, which supported the bill. Instead, they centre around eating habits, anxiety, depression, trauma and control. That means those with eating disorders who fall outside the BMI prescription struggle to get proper care or are expelled from treatment prematurely.

The law will compel health insurers to consider a patient's eating behaviours, heart rate or blood pressure among other criteria when determining treatment coverage. The same law will also limit the sale of diet pills to minors after experts argued that they can exacerbate, or even instigate, eating disorders.

Colorado and several other states tackling the issue are responding to the nearly 30 million Americans who will struggle with an eating disorder, such as anorexia or bulimia, in their lifetime. More than 10,000 people will lose their life to the condition every year, according to data cited by the National Association of Anorexia Nervosa and Associated Disorders.

Eating disorders are not invariably linked to body weight or BMI, said Claire Engels, programme coordinator for the

EU to boost tracking to fight overfishing

BRUSSELS: The EU is moving towards extra tracking and putting cameras on fishing boats to monitor their catches in order to prevent overfishing, under a deal on Wednesday that environmentalists hailed as a "landmark moment."

The planned overhaul of existing fishing rules for the bloc—the world's biggest seafood market—was worked out in talks between the 27 European Union member states and the European Parliament, EU officials said. Once made into EU law, the revised measures would impose technological monitoring of catches and set an EU minimum level of fines for violators calculated on the value of their illegal catch.

All fishing boats would have to be fitted with electronic recording systems, with those over 18 metres or fishing vulnerable stocks facing reinforced monitoring requirements such as onboard cameras and sensors. On the other hand, smaller vessels under 12 metres would have until 2030 to comply with the monitoring rules.

The tolerance for discrepancies between logged and actual catches would be 10%. Although that margin would rise in certain cases, for instance for small-scale fishers. The margin of tolerance for incidentally caught sea-life would be 0.5%. Recreational fishers

catching certain species would have to go through a registration process and electronically report their catch.

The revised rules also call for a new digital system to record catches and help detect illegal, unreported along with unregulated fishing.

Non-EU countries importing fisheries products into the bloc

would need certification through that system.

EU fisheries commissioner Virginijus Sinkevicius, said the revised rules were "making fisheries control fit for the future through increased use of digital technologies."

Steve Trent, CEO of the Environmental Justice Foundation, called it a "landmark moment" against illegal fishing.

"This reform can prevent unscrupulous vessel owners from 'shopping around' to find Member States with weak controls," Trent said. "If the deal is approved and fully implemented, it would increase transparency, reduce hidden overfishing, and establish a more level playing field for EU fishers," he said.

Astronauts return from ISS

Cape Canaveral: A private flight carrying two Saudi astronauts and other passengers returned to Earth late Tuesday night after a nine-day trip to the International Space Station (ISS). The SpaceX capsule carrying the four parachuted into the Gulf of Mexico, just off the Florida panhandle, 12 hours after undocking from the orbiting lab. The Saudi government picked up the multimillion-dollar tab for its two astronauts: Rayyanah Barnawi, a stem cell researcher who became the first Saudi woman in space; and fighter pilot Ali al-Qarni.

Weigh before boarding flights

Wellington: New Zealand's national airline is asking passengers to step on the scales before they board international flights. Air New Zealand says it wants to weigh 10,000 passengers during a month-long survey so pilots can better know the weight and balance of their planes before takeoff. But the numbers from the scales won't be flashing up. There will be no visible display anywhere, the airline promised, and the data will remain anonymous. The airline said the survey began this week and will run through July 2. Health statistics show New Zealanders are becoming heavier. The latest national health survey put the adult obesity rate at 34%, up from 31% a year earlier.
