ARREST OF 2 MC OFFICIALS FOR BRIBERY

Mayor to CVO: Probe seniors as it can't be possible without their support

FOLLOWING THE arrest of two civic body officials by CBI sleuths last week for allegedly accepting a bribe of Rs 1 lakh for reinstating a suspended municipal corporation employee in Sector 17, Mayor Anup Gupta Monday wrote a letter to the Chief Vigilance Officer (CVO) seeking a detailed investigation into the role of senior officers, saying "without their support" this corrupt practice wouldn't have been possible.

The CBI had arrested a health supervisor and chief sanitary inspector.

The letter written to Chief Vigilance Officer Dharma Pal, who is also the UT Adviser, stated:

"As you know, two officials—one health supervisor and chief sanitary inspector of MOH wing—have been caught red-handed by CBI while taking a bribe to reinstate the former employee of MOH wing. This is tarnishing the image of the Municipal Corporation, Chandigarh, and raising questions on the establishment of the MOH wing."

The mayor went on to say, "It also raises a question that without support of the superiors, it cannot be possible and the matter should be inquired into in detail. No one knows how many such people have been appointed and reinstated on outsourced basis for the last one and a half years."

"It is requested that the matter may be thoroughly investigated and action may be taken against

the officials involved in this accordingly," Mayor Gupta said.

The case

Five days ago, the CBI arrested two civic body officials for allegedly accepting a bribe of Rs 1 lakh for reinstating a suspended municipal corporation employee in Sector 17.

The arrested accused were identified as Chief Sanitation Inspector Chand Mohan and Health Superintendent Sandeep Kumar.

Sources said that the bribe amount was found in the car of one of the Municipal Corporation Chandigarh officials.

As per details, while Chand Mohan had the charge of sanitation in the southern division of Chandigarh, Sandeep worked un-

der him. Sources said Chand Mohan had attended a meeting with civic body officials of Moh wing in Sector 17 minutes before his arrest by the CBI, documents of which were also found in his car.

Parking scam too being probed by CBI

The CBI seems to be keeping a close watch on the activities of the Chandigarh civic body.

Already, the parking scam is being investigated by the CBI which had obtained the records of parking from the civic body office. The parking scam of Chandigarh came to light in January this year when the Municipal Corporation (MC) officials approached the bank con-

cessed in New Delhi to recover Rs 6.5-crore dues as licence fee from the Zone 2 contractor through his bank guarantees. They later found that the guarantees were fake and forged.

An FIR was also lodged on February 18 under sections 420 (cheating) of the Indian Penal Code (IPC) following a complaint by the civic body's superintendent (parking) Sunil Dutt, The Economic Offences Wing (EOW) of the Chandigarh Police which was carrying out the investigations in April had also arrested Sanjay Sharma of Delhi, the director of the parking firm (Paschatya Entertainment Private Limited), that submitted the fake bank guarantees. Later, contractor Anil Kumar Sharma was arrested too.

Now the role of Chandigarh civic body officials is being probed.

Consider norms by Delhi gov't for operations of spa, massage centres: HC

FINDING THAT cases under the immoral trafficking are growing in Chandigarh, the Punjab and Haryana High Court has advised the authorities in Chandigarh to mull over issuing guidelines for operations of spa and massage centres as issued by the Delhi government.

The Bench of Justice Mahabir Singh Sindhu made the observation while hearing the pre-arrest bail plea of a owner of a spa centre has been accused of allegedly running a brothel.

The accused, Nagaraj, has been booked by the Chandigarh Police under sections 3, 4, 5, 6 and 7 of the Immoral Traffic (Prevention) Act, 1956 (Act); and Sections 370 and 120-B of the IPC. The counsel for petitioner seeking pre-arrest bail in the mat-

ter contended that Nagaraj has been falsely implicated in the present case. The petition said that the accused was neither present at the time of alleged search nor any incriminating material relating to him was found. Also it was contended that the four co-accused in the matter have already been granted regular bail by the judicial magistrate and there is no other criminal case pending against the petitioner.

The UT counsel claimed that the petitioner is running the so-called Ganga Spa Centre from leased property, where illegal activities of prostitution were happening. The UT also told the court that the petitioner is the kingpin, who has hired innocent girls and using them for flesh trade while taking the benefit of their poor financial condition.

UT got only ₹2 cr aid for renewable sources of energy since 2021-22

FROM THE financial year 2021-22, Chandigarh has only received subsidy of Rs 2 crore by the central government for adopting renewable sources of energy in the Union Territory, details put forth in the Rajya Sabha revealed. Such outstanding funds has greatly affected many residents in the city as they have not received their share of subsidy for installing solar panels on rooftops. The state-wise list of subsidy allocated and disbursed since 2014 for adopting renewable energy sources was given out when a question related to the same was asked in the parliament. While Punjab has received over Rs 155 crore in the last three years till July 2023, Haryana has received over Rs 395 crore as subsidy.

Mohali police tightens security for I-Day, Quami Morcha protest

MOHALI POLICE on Monday beefed up security arrangements ahead of the Independence Day and the Quami Insaaf Morcha protest on the same day.

Inspector General of Police, Ropar Range, Gurpreet Singh Bhullar along with Mohali Senior Superintendent of Police (SSP) Dr Sandeep Gang conducted a review meeting with police officers and personnel at Shaheed (Major) Harmandir Pal Singh Government College in Phase VI regarding security arrangements.

Bhullar stressed that the district police has made all the necessary security preparations for the Independence Day, and no one would be allowed to disrupt the law and order situation.

The Quami Insaaf Morcha had also given a call for carrying out a protest on August 15, due to which elaborate security arrangements have been made with set up of special nakas across the district.

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security programme was divided into three phases. Under the first phase, various places like societies and other residential places are being checked. In the second phase, action is being taken to maintain the law and order situation during district level and other events related to Independence Day. In the final phase, strict measures are to be taken from August 15 till the next few days after the conclusion of district-level events.

Bhullar said that additional force has also been provided, which will be deployed according to the requirement. Monitoring of "anti-social elements" and the criminals out on bail is also being done minutely, the IG added.

Man found murdered at Balongi

Mohali: A man was allegedly found dead murdered in Balongi on Monday. Police launched the investigation after registering the case. The preliminary investigation indicated the accused had a quarrel before his alleged murder. According to the police, the victim was identified as Dalip Saxena, a native of Ferozabad in Uttar Pradesh (UP). The stab wounds were found on Dalip's body. The complainant Sangeta told the police that her brother-in-law Dalip Saxena was staying with them for the past 15 days and some unidentified person had stabbed Dalip near her house. Police launched the investigation after registering a case under Section 302 (murder) of the Indian Penal Code (IPC) against unidentified persons at Balongi police station.

2 cases of immigration fraud filed

Mohali: The Mattour police registered two cases of immigration fraud on Monday. The first case was registered against Amritpal Singh and his wife Rajwinder Kaur on the complaint of Karamjit Kaur Virk. The complainant alleged that the accused had taken Rs 2 lakh from her to send her abroad. She alleged that the accused neither sent her abroad nor returned the money. The second case was registered against Chavi Sharma, Kamaljeet Kaur and Monica on the complaint of Varinder Singh. The complainant alleged that the accused had taken Rs 7 lakh from him to send him abroad but instead chattered him. The police booked the accused under sections 406 (criminal breach of trust) and 420 (cheating) of the Indian Penal Code.

Month on, man held for killing aunt

Mohali: A man, accused of murdering his aunt and was absconding for the last one month, has been arrested by Zafarpur police and remained in two days police custody. The Senior Superintendent of Police (SSP) Dr Sandeep Gang said that on July 19, an elderly woman Sarifa visited his brother's residence at Adarsh Nagar, where she had an argument with his nephews Suraj, Shekhar and Sagar. She was violently attacked by the trio with a sharp weapon—a broken bottle, due to which she got grievously injured. All the accused were absconding since the time of the incident. Later, the victim succumbed to her injuries on July 22. The accused was produced in a Dera Bassi court and remained in two-day police custody.

Meet of Stillbirth Society of India

Chandigarh: The first national conference of Stillbirth Society of India (SBSICON) was held in PGIMER this week. The conference was organised by the Department of Obstetrics and Gynaecology, PGIMER Chandigarh. Several experts from all over India including public health champions in this field attended the conference. The theme of the conference was, "Preventing Preventable Stillbirths" (awareness of child in the womb), with a focus on three key areas: diagnosis, prevention, and support. According to a recent survey, India has one of the highest stillbirth rates in the world, and these numbers are not mere statistics. **ENS**

UKRAINIAN FORCES RETAKE LAND NEAR BAKHMUT: KYIV

Russian fighters pushed out of frontline areas after days of fighting

THE Ukrainian military on Monday said it had pushed Russian forces out of pockets of territory along front lines in the east and south of the country, building on a gruelling counter-offensive launched two months ago.

The gains — announced by Ukraine's deputy defence minister — came as Russia claimed its forces had progressed in the eastern Kharkiv region, undermining Kyiv's highly anticipated campaign.

The Russian army said its forces repelled six attacks and counter-attacks in Ukraine's north east, and attacked Ukrainian facilities used to produce drone boats in an overnight strike.

"The aim of the strike was achieved. All designated targets were hit," it said in a statement Monday.

Ukraine kicked off its counter-offensive against Russian forces in June after building up assault battalions and stockpiling Western-donated weapons. But Kyiv has acknowledged that movement against heavily fortified Russian positions has been slow and said it had gained only a clutch of land around the war-battered city of Bakhmut last week.

"In the Bakhmut sector, three square kilometres were liberated last week," Deputy Defence Minister Ganna Malyar told state television, adding that Ukrainian forces had clawed back 40 square kilometres there since June.

She explained that Ukrainian forces had been diverted from offensive operations around the town — captured by Russian forces in May — citing building Russian pressure in

Chinese defence minister to visit Russia, Belarus

Chinese Defence Minister Li Shangfu is visiting Russia and Belarus in a show of support for those nations which the West has sought to isolate over Russia's invasion of Ukraine. Li departed from China on Monday on the six-day trip, during which he is expected to deliver an address at the Moscow Conference on International Security

the Kharkiv region.

"It was important for the enemy to divert our forces in other directions, so we could not concentrate our forces for the offensive in the Bakhmut sector," Malyar said.

Kyiv has also been pressing against deeply entrenched Russian forces in the south of the country in two regions the Kremlin said it had annexed last year. Malyar said Kyiv's army had made gains in two villages on the southern front but also confirmed Ukrainian troops had conducted "certain tasks" on the left bank of the Dniipro river in the Kherson region. Anwar-ul-Haq Kakar takes charge as Pak's caretaker premier

ISLAMABAD

ANWAR-UL-HAQ Kakar, an ethnic Pushtun leader who is considered close to the powerful military, was on Monday sworn in as Pakistan's caretaker prime minister to head a neutral political set-up to run the country and conduct the next general elections.

President Arif Alvi administered the oath to 52-year-old Kakar at a simple ceremony held at the President House, attended by outgoing prime minister Shehbaz Sharif and several top leaders. He became the 8th interim prime minister of Pakistan.

Kakar, an ethnic Pushtun from the Balochistan province, was unanimously chosen as interim premier to oversee the elections as provided in the Constitution. He was serving as a senator but resigned from the post after his appointment as prime minister.

The acting premier, a first-time Senator also resigned from the Balochistan Awami Party (BAP), a party set up in 2018 and deemed closer to the powerful establishment of the country.

After taking the oath, Kakar drove to the PM House, the palatial official residence of prime minister nestled in the foothills of the Margalla mountains, where he was introduced to the new staff.

The immediate task of Kakar is to

form a cabinet to assist him run the country. According to insiders, Jilil Abbas Jilani, a former career diplomat, is expected to be appointed as foreign minister. He was also among the runners for the post of interim premier. Kakar now faces the daunting task of holding free and fair elections and keeping the fragile economy on an even keel. PTI

Niger junta vows to charge ousted president with high treason

NIAMEY: Niger's mutinous soldiers said they will prosecute deposed President Mohamed Bazoum for "high treason" and undermining state security, in an announcement hours after the junta said they were open to dialogue with West African nations to resolve the mounting regional crisis. If found guilty, Bazoum could face the death penalty, according to Niger's penal code. Spokesman Col Maj Amadou Abdramane said on state television Sunday night that the military regime had "gathered the necessary evidence to prosecute before competent national and international authorities the ousted president and his local and foreign accomplices for high treason and for undermining the security of Niger."

Hindu temple vandalised in Canada

TORONTO

A prominent temple in Canada's British Columbia province has been vandalised by two Khalistan supporters with "anti-Hindu and anti-India graffiti", the latest such incident targeting Hindu places of worship in the country. The incident took place in the early hours of Sunday at the Shri Lakshmi Narayan Mandir in Surrey.

According to the Facebook page of the temple, one male and one female jumped over the outside boundary and purposely pasted #Khalistanreferendum Posters on the Main Entry Gate and Main Entrance of the Surrey Mandir," the post read.

India has previously condemned the attacks on Hindu temples by Khalistan supporters in Canada and sought action against the perpetrators.

This act was done to create an atmosphere of fear among Hindus, it said.

"These hate mongers and attention seekers have not even left the Hindu Temple and disgraced Shri Lakshmi Narayan Mandir, Surrey by putting these posters on the mandir's main door that too by trespassing the mandir's property," the website of the temple said. PTI
